Activity Description	An opportunity to experience hands on skills in hairdressing and beauty therapy and an insight into the industry. A very practical course which aims to build self-confidence and personal presentation, offering transferable skills suitable for many career paths.
Entry Requirement	Pleasant manner and a genuine interest in the subject matter. Applicants need not be looking to follow a career in hairdressing or beauty therapy, the course is open to all as there are many transferable skills. Selection will be by a member of Fife College Staff.
Content	Learners will work towards achieving the Group Award 'Entry 3 Certificate in An Introduction to the Hair and Beauty sector', which incorporates the following units: 001 – Introduction to the Hair and Beauty Sector – This unit should enable learners to gain a general introduction to the hair and beauty sector and understand the range of services and treatment on offer. 002 - Presenting a Professional Image in a Salon - This unit should enable learners to present a professional image in a salon environment and communicate and behave professionally in a salon environment. 004 - Hair Plaiting - This unit should enable students to provide basic plaiting techniques under supervision. 005 - Create an Image Using Colour for the Hair and Beauty sector - This unit should enable learners to know the colour spectrum and use it within the hair and beauty industries. 006 – Skin Care - This unit should enable learners to know how to prepare for and provide basic skin care treatment under supervision. 007 - Hand Care - This unit should enable learners to know how to prepare and provide basic hand care treatments under supervision During practical sessions, learners often work in pairs and will carry out treatments on one another. Group work and learner participation is encouraged during theory lessons. Most sessions will involve a mixture of hands on practical and theoretical study. Units will be assessed by an assignment covering practical skills and underpinning knowledge.

SCQF 3 - AN INTRODUCTION TO THE HAIR AND BEAUTY INDUSTRY – Units within the Course and Outcomes assessed

001 – Introduction to the Hair and Beauty Sector

This unit should enable learners to gain a general introduction to the hair and beauty sector and understand the range of services and treatment on offer.

OUTCOMES

- 1 Know the career opportunities within the hair and beauty sector
- 2 Know the main hairdressing services and beauty treatments

002 - Presenting a Professional Image in a Salon

This unit should enable learners to present a professional image in a salon environment and communicate and behave professionally in a salon environment

OUTCOMES

- 1 Be able to present a professional image in a salon environment
- 2 Be able to communicate and behave in a salon environment

004 HAIR PLAITING

This unit should enable students to provide basic plaiting techniques under supervision.

OUTCOMES

- 1 Be able to prepare for hair plaiting service
- 2 Be able to carry out hair plaiting techniques

005 CREATE AN IMAGE USING COLOUR FOR THE HAIR AND BEAUTY SECTOR

This unit should enable learners to know the colour spectrum and use it within the hair and beauty industries.

OUTCOMES

- 1 Know the colour spectrum
- 2 Be able to use the colour spectrum in the hair and beauty industries

006 SKIN CARE

This unit should enable learners to know how to prepare for and provide basic skin care treatment under supervision.

OUTCOMES

- 1 Be able to prepare for skin care treatment
- 2 Be able to provide skin care treatment

007 HAND CARE

This unit should enable learners to know how to prepare and provide basic hand care treatments under supervision.

OUTCOMES

- 1 Be able to prepare for hand care treatment
- 2 Be able to carry out hand care treatment

Activities may involve:

- Creativity – backed up by research into current trends. Young people will be encouraged to use ICT and magazines to research up to date looks which their tutor will then guide them to create, learning new skills along the way in hairdressing and make up application.
- Hair dressing skills – how to style hair using basic professional techniques
- Skin care – learn about skin types and how to care for the skin, involving practical skills such as cleanse, tone and moisturise.
- Hand and nail care – care for, enhance and embellish the hands and nails. Learn how to soften the skin, shape and paint the nails and may incorporate creative nail art.
- Learn about careers within hairdressing and beauty therapy – there are many career paths which can be followed, learners will be encouraged and guided to research these to gain understanding and inspiration for the future.
